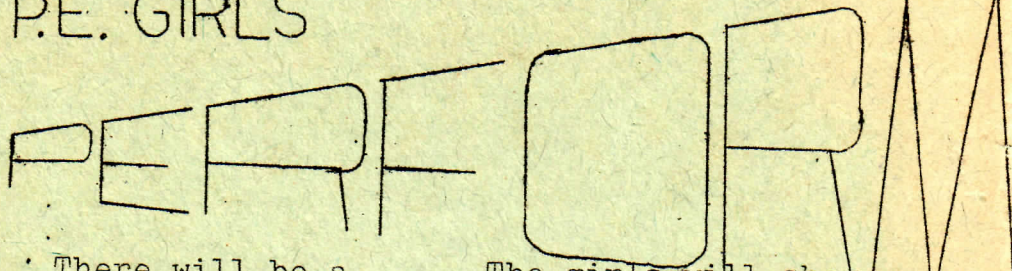
More people will be added each month, for the aides will help until the end of the year. We do hope that we are helping.

Dear Concerned reader,

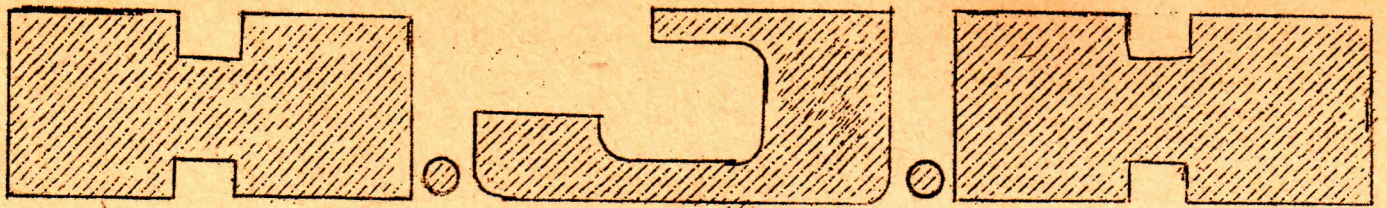

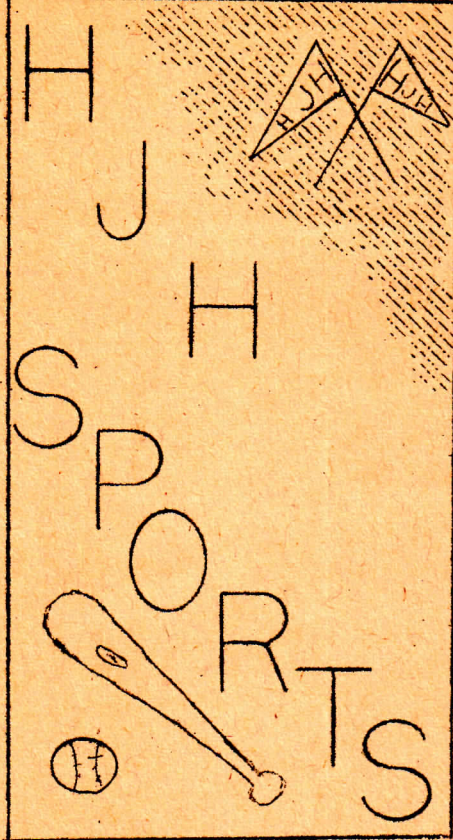

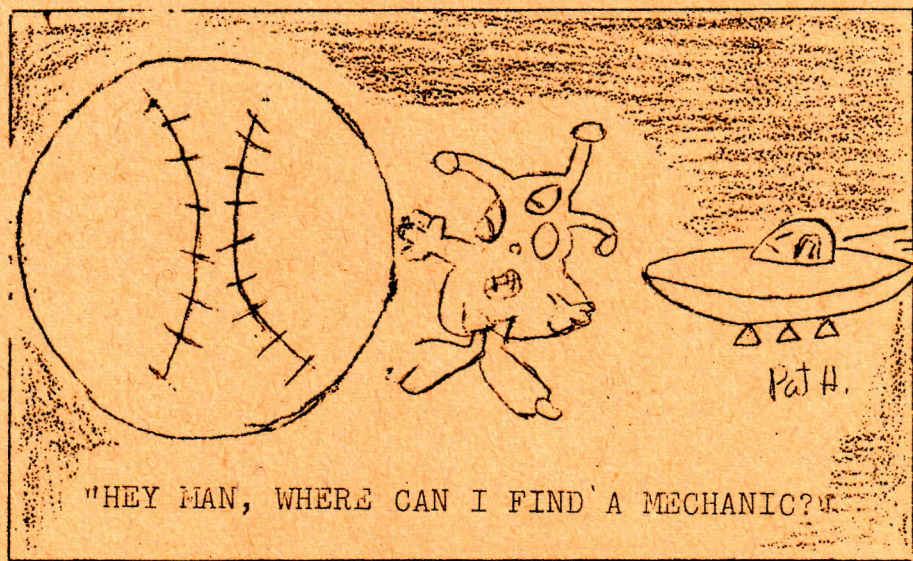

- In 1971 Bubba Smith walked around the field in P. E. 5 times.

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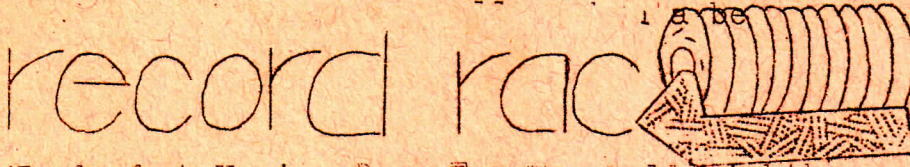

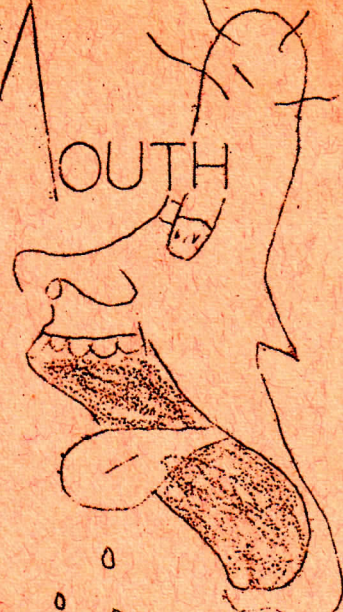
