I have my own choice.

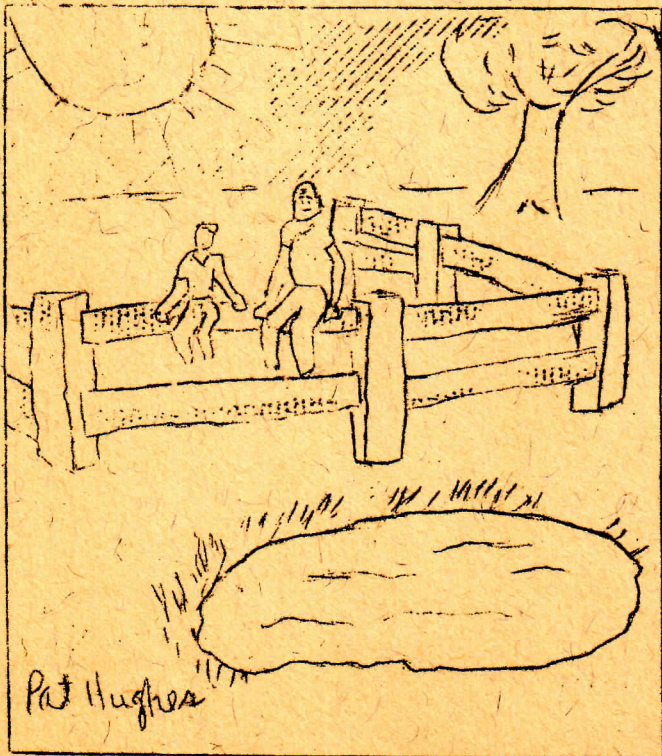
The park-keeper replied

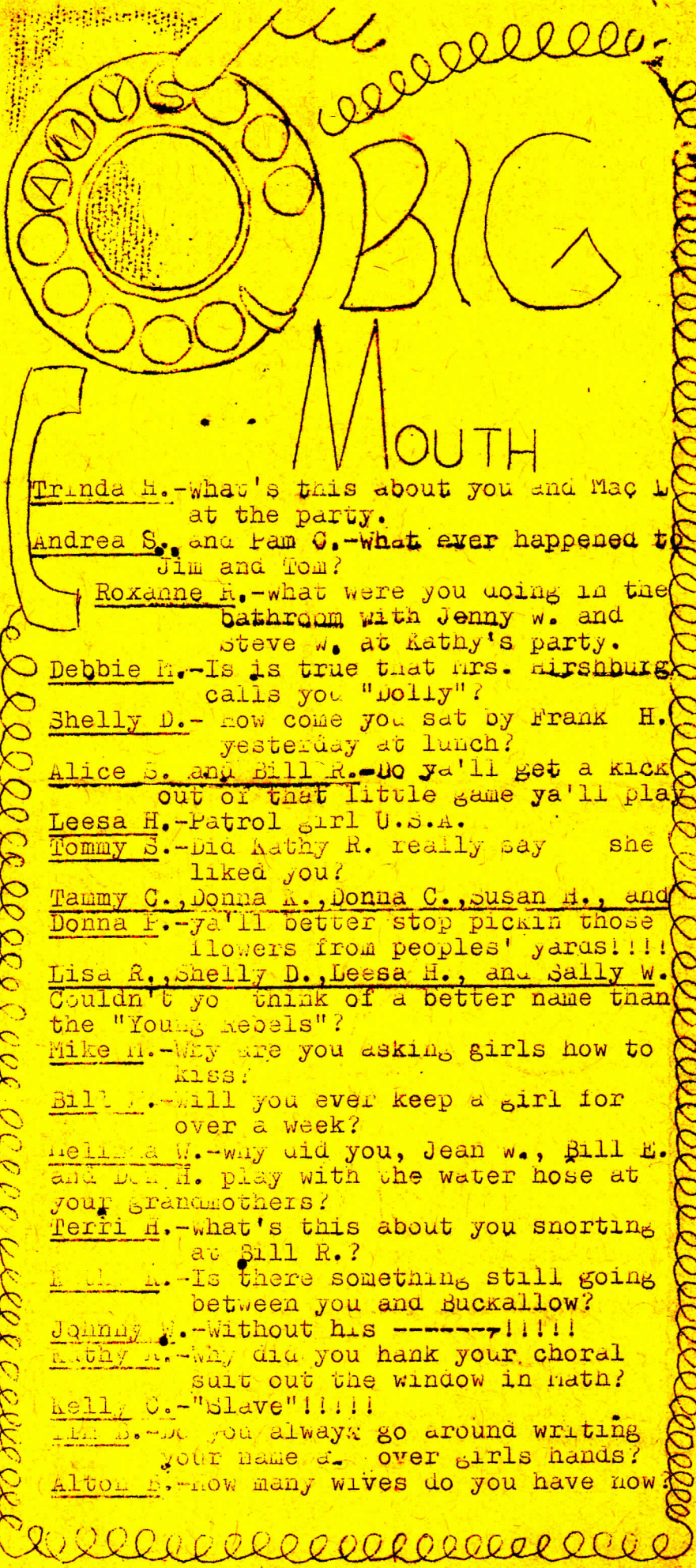
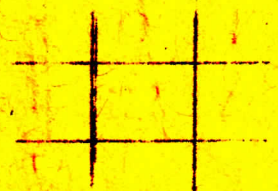

When asked what he liked best about HJH he replied, "I get away from home."

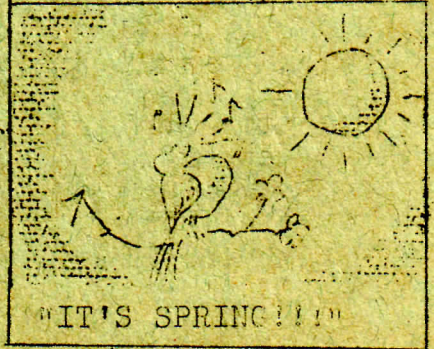
His favorite past-time is going with his friends on Friday night. Jeff also wishes to attend the University of Alabama and hopes to be an architect.

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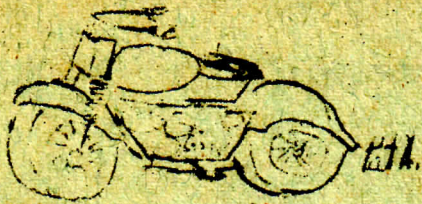
